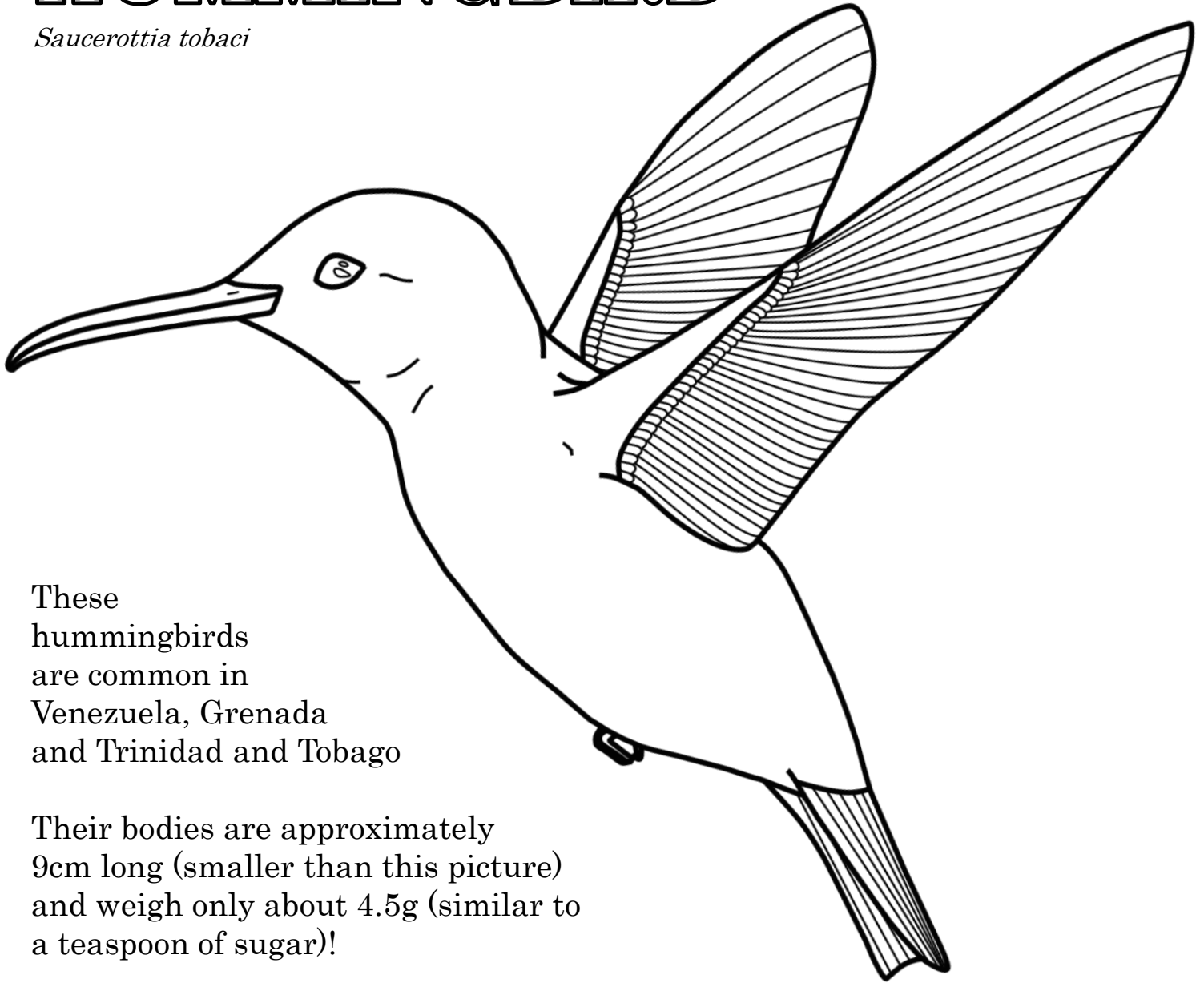


COPPER-RUMPED HUMMINGBIRD

Saucerottia tobaci



These hummingbirds are common in Venezuela, Grenada and Trinidad and Tobago

Their bodies are approximately 9cm long (smaller than this picture) and weigh only about 4.5g (similar to a teaspoon of sugar)!

Copper-rumped hummingbirds live in a range of habitats and eat nectar and small insects

Hummingbirds are the only birds that can fly backwards – their unique wing and joint structures also let them to hover in place and fly upside down!

Hummingbirds commonly build their nests using spider webs, lichens and plant materials
