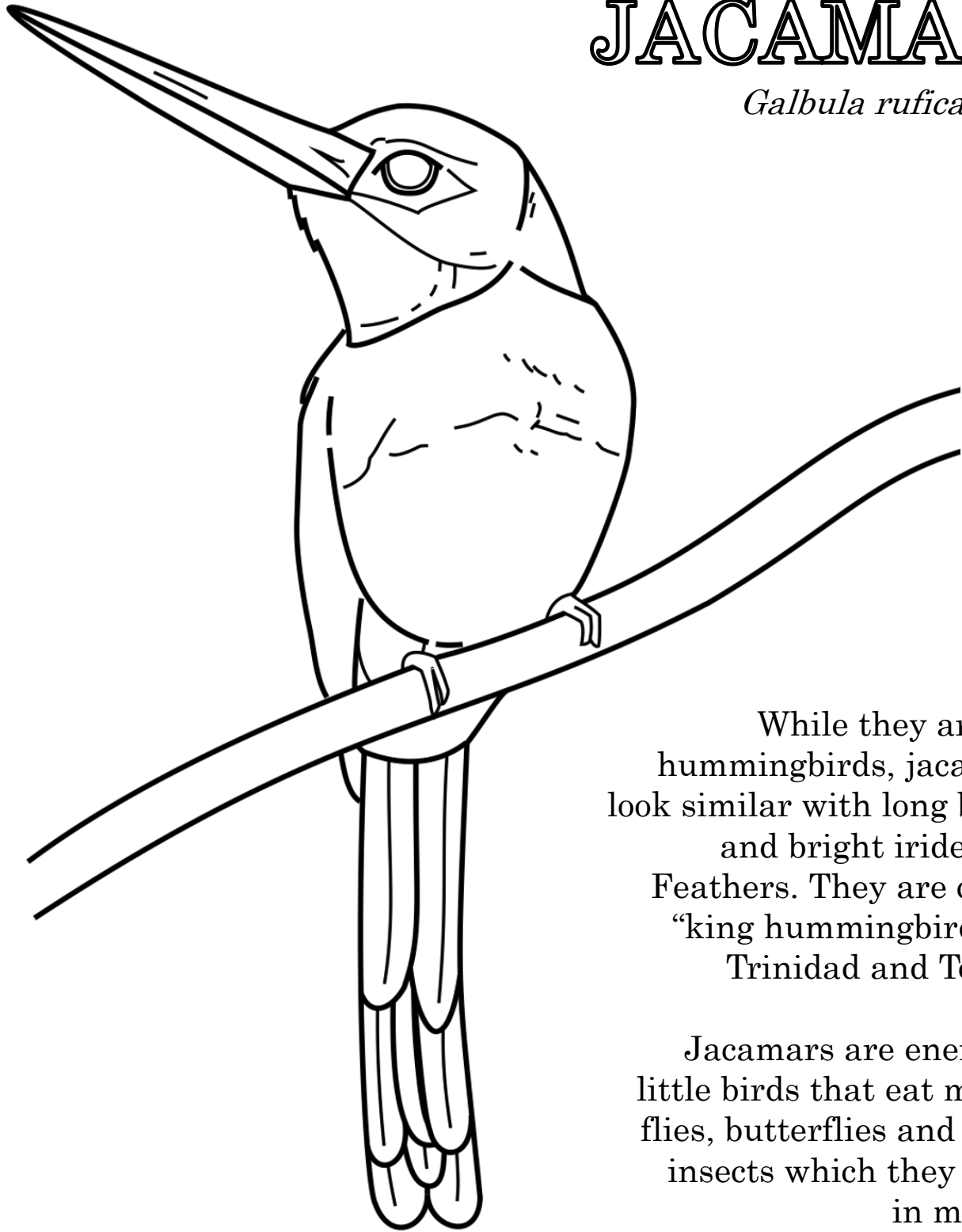


RUFIOUS-TAILED JACAMAR

Galbula ruficauda



While they are not hummingbirds, jacamars look similar with long beaks and bright iridescent feathers. They are called “king hummingbirds” in Trinidad and Tobago

Jacamars are energetic little birds that eat mostly flies, butterflies and other insects which they catch in mid-air

Jacamars nest in burrows which they make by tunnelling into river banks, steep slopes, dead trees or even termite nests
